- Visit to the Musical Instrument Museum (MIM) containing more than three thousand musical instruments and objects displayed in five major Geo-Galleries
- Dinner at a local restaurant
- Performance as part of the National Festival of the States
- Return to the hotel for overnight

Day Four:

- Breakfast at the hotel and check-out
- Visit the Heard Museum of Native Cultures and Art to learn about the heritage and the living cultures and arts of Natives from the Southwest
- Lunch, on own
- Afternoon departure for home


