Congress Tour Itinerary #2 (8 nights / 10 days)

Sunday, December 26th, 2010

Depart from the USA via scheduled air service, including full meal, beverage service and in-flight entertainment. The destination is Rome, Italy.

Monday, December 27th Rome

Arrive in Rome. Meet your Tour Manager, who will assist the group to awaiting chartered motorcoach for a transfer to the hotel via panoramic tour of Rome's highlights, stopping at such sites as Piazza Navona, Trevi Fountain, and Spanish Steps. Evening Welcome Dinner (in individual accommodations) and overnight.



Rome - Popes, Vandals, the Borgias and Napoleon, Garibaldi, Michelangelo and Mussolini and, of course, the ancient Romans themselves all have left their physical and spiritual mark on Rome, but though she keeps the glory of an ancient day about her, she remains a wellspring of creative energy; she really is the Eternal City.

Tuesday, December 28th Rome

Take a half-day guided tour of Religious Rome. Visit Vatican City, the home of the Pope and the center of Roman Catholicism, as well as the Vatican Museum (using the whisper system), St. Peter's Basilica and the Sistine Chapel (featuring Michelangelo's Ceiling Frescos and The Last Judgment).

Lunch on own (paying individually)

Afternoon at leisure; motorcoach and Tour Manager at the group's disposal

6:00pm Opening Ceremonies in Sala Nervi

Dinner in a nearby restaurant

Morning Mass or Liturgy by Nations (to take place in several churches in Rome)

6:00pm Participation in Star Concerts (to take place in parish churches)

Thursday, December 30th Rome

Morning rehearsal for the closing Mass in Sala Nervi

Possible audience with the Holy Father

Lunch on own (paying individually)

Rehearsal for choirs singing in the Christmas concert

Afternoon Prayer for Peace service in St. Peter's Basilica

Rehearsal for the Gala Concert

Dinner in hotel or a local restaurant

Gala Concert (The Mysteries of the Rosary) in Sta. Maria Maggiore

Return to hotel for overnight



Friday December 31st Rome

Breakfast at the hotel

Half-day guided tour of Imperial Rome, including entrance to the Roman Forum and Colosseum. Also view the Pantheon, Baths of Caracalla and Palatine Hill

Evening Christmas Concert in Sala Nervi

New Year's Eve Dinner in a local restaurant

Return to hotel for overnight



Saturday, January 1st, 2011 Rome

Breakfast at the hotel

Sing in morning Pontifical Mass in St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican

Afternoon visit to Basilica di San Giovanni in Laterano and Basilica di San Paolo fuori le Mura. Basilica di San Giovanni in Laterano (St. John in Lateran) is the Cathedral of Rome, the mother of all churches in Rome and in the world. Founded by Constantine, during the time of Pope Silvester (314-335) it has been destroyed and rebuilt many times. The current Basilica dates from the 17th century. Basilica di San Paolo fuori le Mura (St. Paul Outside the Walls) was built over the burial place of the Apostle of the Gentiles and consecrated in 324. The building of the first place of worship over St. Paul's tomb has been attributed to the Emperor Constantine. A larger basilica was erected by the Emperors Valentiniano II, Theodosius and Arcadius. Destroyed by fire in 1823, it was rebuilt on the same foundations and consecrated by Pope Pius IX.

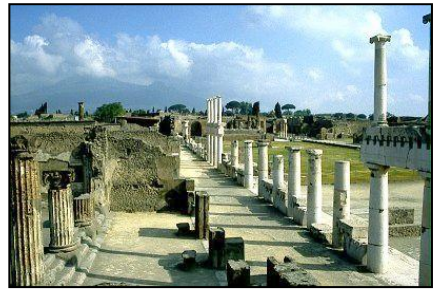
Farewell Dinner and overnight



Sunday, January 2nd Rome / Pompeii / Naples

Transfer to Naples via Pompeii. Entrance is included to Pompeii which was buried by an eruption by Mount Vesuvius in August, 79 AD. The excavations, begun in the 18th Century have unearthed some of the best artifacts of Roman life.

Continue to Naples for overnight.



The south Italian port town of Naples, principal town of the region of Campania and of the province of N apoli, lies on the north side of the Bay of Naples, on the Tyrrhenian Sea, extending along the lower slopes of attractive hills. The old town with its narrow streets and stepped lanes and its tall balconied houses is fringed on the west and north by extensive villa suburbs. In recent years much of the city has been redeveloped with new buildings and realigned streets, particularly in the area around the harbor, the Rione Santa Lucia. Naples possesses many historical monuments going back almost 3,000 years, particularly the treasures, to be seen in the National Museum, garnered from the cities engulfed by Mount Vesuvius.

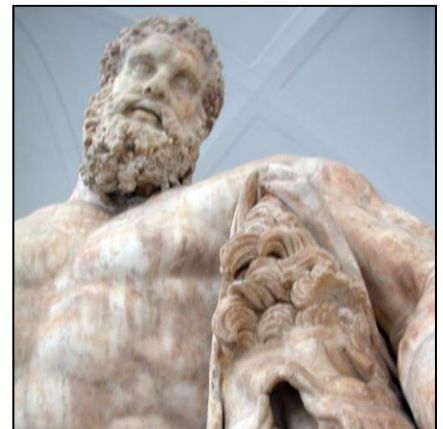


Monday January 3rd Naples / Rome

Full-day guided tour of Sorrento and the Amalfi Coast, visiting Sorrento Peninsula, Positano, Furore Valley, Salerno, and a stop at cameo factory.

Return to Naples for sightseeing including entrance to Museo Archeologico Nazionale. The National Archeological Museum occupies a group of 16th century buildings which were originally intended to house the royal cavalry, and then became the seat of the university from 1610 to 1777. The collections comprise many works of art belonging to the Farnese family and treasures discovered at Pompeii and Herculaneum. It is one of the richest museums in the world for Greco-Roman antiquities.

Late afternoon transfer Rome for Farewell Dinner and overnight.



Tuesday January 4th Depart for home

Transfer to Rome's International Airport for return flight to USA. Arrive home in the evening of the same day.
