Day 1 Montréal

Arrive in Montréal

Upon arrival, meet your MCI Tour Manager, who will assist you to the hotel for check in and will answer any inquiries

Dinner at a local restaurant

Founded three and a half centuries ago, Montréal is the second largest French speaking city in the world. For visitors, Montréal's greatest attraction is its cosmopolitan, almost European atmosphere. The meeting of French and English cultures and the addition of other ethnic influences have created a unique blend. Its varied and vibrant neighbourhoods, such as Old Montréal with its picturesque cobbled streets and historic grey limestone buildings, or the "Latin Quarter" of St. Denis Street with its lively outdoor cafes, provide a refreshing, every-changing urban panorama.

Take time for shopping in the afternoon

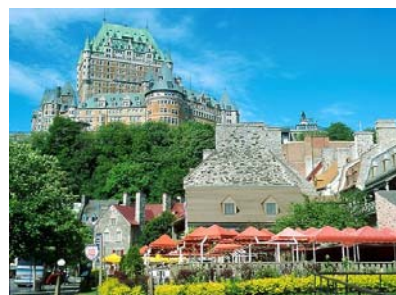

Day 3 Montreal / Québec City (150 miles, 3 hours)

Breakfast at the hotel

Drive south and meet up with the mighty St. Lawrence River, which we follow along the scenic Chemin du Roy Highway. Pass numerous historical French-Canadian villages en route to Québec City, the only walled city in North America



Québec City or Québec (French: Ville de Québec, or simply Québec) is the capital of the Canadian province of Québec. It is the second largest city in the province, after Montréal. Québec's Old Town (Vieux-Québec), the only North American fortified city north of Mexico whose walls still exist, was declared a World Heritage Site by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in 1985 as the "Historic District of Old Quebec". It is also one of the oldest cities in North America.



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Upon arrival, check-in to the hotel Royal William, or similar

Lunch, on own

Afternoon guided tour of Québec City's La Citadelle. This national historic site is a walled fortress of the city. Also visit the Royal 22 Regiment Museum. Then wander Dufferin Terrace and view le Chateau Frontenac

Day 4 Québec City

Breakfast at the hotel

Enjoy a full day sightseeing tour of Québec City with a local English-speaking guide. Take a tour within the walls of the Old City, visit Lower Town and Battlefields Park before continuing along the Beauport Coast. The village of Sainte-Anne houses one of the country's most beautiful cathedrals. Stops are made to view the lovely Montmorency Falls and a typical Québec bake oven
