## An Exclusive Concert Series

Sunsets are part and parcel of a trip to South Africa. From deserted canyons, gorgeous lakes, and lush green landscapes, to the enigmatic super-cities of Johannesburg and Cape Town, South Africa claws at the imagination and strums at the heartstrings. The country has an abundance of natural beauty and a diverse range of flora and fauna, including those few animals that have captured humans' imaginations in all corners of the globe: lions, zebras, cheetahs, and rhinos.

A concert tour to South Africa is an incredibly diverse experience, and could include a sustainable safari, a stay at a rural lodge, or even mountain-trekking. In Cape Town, a visit to the South African Museum, with its world-famous Bushman exhibits, is a must. Also, a tour of the District Six Museum, which in 1966 was declared a white area under the Group areas Act of 1950, takes visitors back to the dark area of apartheid that tainted the country. 60,000 people were forcibly removed to barren outlying areas known as the Cape Flats, and their houses in District Six were flattened by bulldozers. A visit to Robben Island, the imprisoned home to Nelson Mandela for 18 years, is also a somber reminder of the country's dark past. A day trip to the Cape of Good Hope, the majestic meeting place of the Indian and Atlantic oceans, is a sight to behold.

No matter where you are in South Africa, its musical heritage is never far away. Music tours can be found at many major vineyards, offering pairings of locally-produced wines set against complementary seasonal music. Visitors may experience South Africa's traditional Gospel music, neo-traditional African music, and the deep basslines and tantalizing rhythms of Kwaito – a genre of house music endemic and unique to the country. Visitors could also indulge in a concert of the Soweto String Quartet, with classically-trained musicians bringing their own fresh approach to time-honored classical genres. The calendar around the country is packed with sensational music events: the Macufe Festival of African Arts, the Cape Classic, and the South African Choral Festival are all recipes for a fantastic African musical experience.

All in all, South Africa is a fantastic and unique option for a concert tour - packed with both highly musical, historical, and cultural experiences.

The American Celebrations of Music is a special annual performance-tour program, co-sponsored by local governments, music associations, community organizations, and tourist boards around the globe. In many countries this has developed into a prestigious, recognized, year-long concert-series festival. Recognition of this festival facilitates greater access to performance venues, official publicity, generally very successful concert arrangements, and the ability to touch local cultures in a way that may not be done through other affiliations. This equates to more meaningful musical and emotional experiences for participating performance ensembles.

### Sample Itinerary

CAPE TOWN / JOHANNESBURG PILANESBERG / PRETORIA

#### DAY ONE: ARRIVE

Depart via scheduled air service to Cape Town, South Africa

#### DAY TWO: CAPE TOWN

Bo-Kaap is an historical center of Cape Malay culture in Cape Town Ascend to the top of Table Mountain voted one of the seven wonders of nature.

#### DAY FOUR: CAPE TOWN

#### Breakfast at the hotel

Full day Cape Peninsula tour to the majestic meeting place of the Indian and Atlantic oceans. Morning drive to Hout Bay. Arrive and board a glass-bottomed vessel to the Seal Colony, a 40 minute scenic excursion to Duiker Island.

Continue via Chapman's Peak for a two-hour drive to cape point, the most Southern tip of Africa. Visit the Good Hope Nature Reserve ascending by funicular and view the meeting of the Atlantic and Indian Oceans Travel North to the Naval base of Simon's Town

Enjoy lunch at Bertha's restaurant

Visit Penguin Colony, with the history of their return to "The Boulders"

#### DAY FIVE: CAPE TOWN

Walk to Nelson Mandela Gateway on the waterfront to catch the ferry to Robben Island. From the 17th to the 20th centuries, Robben Island served as a place of banishment, isolation and imprisonment.

#### Lunch on own at the waterfront

Special African dinner at the Gold Restaurant. From the moment you walk through the glass doors into the aged brick interior, with its ancient doors, wooden beams and iron pillars, you will feel the heartbeat of a unique African restaurant in Cape Town

#### DAY SIX: CAPE TOWN / JOHANNESBURG

#### Breakfast at the hotel

Morning visit to Le Bonheur Crocodile Farm as well as Butterfly World We also visit the student town of Stellenbosch for lunch on own Continue to the airport for your afternoon flight to Johannesburg Upon arrival, transfer to the hotel for dinner and overnight









#### DAY SEVEN: JOHANNESBURG

Depart for Soweto for morning tour. This popular tour includes a visit to attractions such as the Mandela House Museum, the Hector Pieterson Museum and Memorial site and the Regina Mundi Church. Afternoon concert in Soweto as part of the American Celebration of Music in South Africa

#### DAY EIGHT: JOHANNESBURG / PILANESBERG

#### Transfer to Pilanesberg

Upon arrival, check in at the Bakgatla Resort in five sleeper chalet's Afternoon game drive in the Pilanesberg Game Reserve by bus (open vehicles at additional cost). The park is home to healthy populations of lion, leopard, black and white rhino, elephant and buffalo - Africa's "Big Five". Evening visit to the Sun City Resort, home of the annual 1 million dollar Golf tournament. The resort includes lots of entertainment such as gambling, shows, an upmarket sports bar, and a nightclub Possible performance in this world famous resort\*

#### DAY NINE: PILANESBERG / PRETORIA

This morning enjoy another game drive through Pilanesberg Depart to Pretoria with a stop en-route at a flea market for some shopping and independent lunch

Upon arrival in Pretoria spend some more time shopping at Menlyn Park shopping center

Continue to your hotel for check in

Special Farewell Dinner at a local restaurant


#### DAY TEN: DEPART FOR HOME

Visit the Voortrekker Monument, a unique Monument which commemorates the Pioneer history of Southern Africa and the history of the Afrikaner and is situated in a beautiful setting. From here we go to the center of Pretoria and drive past the Kruger House, the historic Church Square, and lastly a stop at the Union Buildings, which also house the office of the President of South Africa
