**A valid passport and visa are required to enter and exit China.** The cost for this visa is not included in the above pricing, and must be secured by each participant in the Director Preview Tour. The visa must be obtained from a Chinese embassy, consulate, or passport facility before traveling to China.

Application and deposit must be received no later than May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010.

Tour Itinerary

## Sunday, June 20, 2010

Depart via scheduled air service. The destination is Beijing, China.

## Monday, June 21, 2010 Beijing (L,D)

Arrive in Beijing Airport, where you will be met by MCI's Chinese staff who will assist the group to awaiting chartered motorcoach for the transfer to a downtown hotel. Time permitting, enjoy a brief orientation tour of Beijing en route to hotel check-in.

## Tuesday, June 22, 2010 Beijing (B,L,D)

Aboard your motorcoach en route to sightseeing, enjoy some orientation about Chinese culture, a brief history, and the economic and political situations. Visit Tian An Men Square, the largest open plaza in the world (it accommodates half a million people at one time!). Visit the Forbidden City (Palace Museum), the former Imperial Palace for the 24 Emperors of the Ming and Qing Dynasty. Then visit the Central Conservatory of Music and see its Concert Hall. Visit the Beijing Concert Hall and the National Arts Performing Center Concert Hall. Evening Peking Roast Duck Welcome Dinner hosted by: President Xing and Director Yu of the Music School, and Professors Wu and Li of All-China Chorus Association.

## Wednesday, June 23, 2010 Beijing (B,L,D)

Take an excursion to the Great Wall of China at Ju Yong Pass, one of the world's architectural wonders. Visit some of the Olympic venues. Enjoy a Hutong Rickshaw Tour followed by an evening acrobatic show.

## Thursday, June 24, 2010 Xi'an (B,L,D)

Early morning flight to Xi'an. Upon arrival, visit the Terra-cotta Warriors and Horses Museum, acclaimed as the "*Eighth Wonder of the World.*" Also visit the Ancient City Wall, the only complete city wall existing in China. Welcome Banquet - Dumpling Feast. In the evening, visit the night markets

## Friday, June 25, 2010 Xi'an (B,L,D)

Early morning, participate in Taichi exercise and enjoy the performance of Martial Arts. Then visit the Qujiang District and meet with Lt. Governor Yao and his staff to tour the Tang Dynasty Palace Theme Park and the newly built Concert Hall & other facilities. Attend the Palace Night Show.

## Saturday, June 26, 2010 Depart for home (B)

Early morning flight back to Beijing. From Beijing, return home via scheduled airline service.
